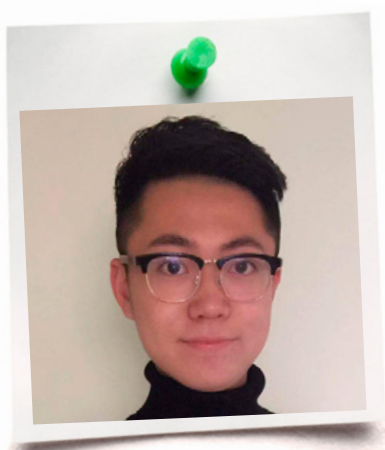


# DE INTERNATIONAL STUDENT STORIES
